

## **AVAILABILITY ANALYSIS**

(Section 46a-68-84)

January 2016

### **INTRODUCTORY NOTES**

In the review of the 2014 *Plan*, this section was found to be weak

In the *Plan* evaluation, Dr. Valerie Kennedy noted several errors in the data and calculations. All errors in the data and calculations were reviewed and corrected. In preparation of the 2015 *Plan*, additional steps were taken to ensure the correctness of data and the resulting calculations.

#### **Subsection (a)**

Availability analyses were conducted by occupational category for each labor market area. Separate analyses were performed for payroll titles with 25 or more employees. Additionally separate analyses were performed for job titles requiring unique skills, abilities or educational qualifications. Remaining titles in the occupational categories were handled as groups.

Several job titles in this Plan year exceeded 25 employees. These categories are University Staff Professional 2, UCP 9 OSD Consultant & Project Manager, UCP 6 Administrative Services Assistant 4, UCP 5 Academic Advisor 1 and UCP 5 Financial Assistant 2. Separate analyses were conducted for these categories. No categories were eliminated.

The job content of each office, position, and position classification within an occupational category or, where appropriate, the job content of a position classification was examined and matched with the most nearly parallel job title from the data sources utilized and a relevant labor market was identified.

For the executive-managerial and faculty categories, the recruitment areas are statewide and national. Statewide data was used for professional non-faculty categories. Local labor markets were used for secretarial-clerical, technical-paraprofessional, qualified craft workers and service maintenance categories. Statewide labor markets were used for the Protective Services category at all campuses. For the regional campuses, the local labor market areas in which each regional campus is geographically located were utilized.

#### **Subsection (b)**

The following data elements were considered in calculating availability for each category:

- employment figures
- unemployment figures

- the racial and sexual composition of the persons in promotable and/or transferable offices, positions and position classifications

### Faculty Promotional Pools

In the faculty job categories, those potentially eligible for promotions in the *Plan* year, based on the requirements of the Promotions, Tenure, and Reappointment (PTR) procedures, were included in the promotional pools. To determine eligibility for promotion, a hire date consistent with the typical tenure schedule was utilized as the cutoff. All employees hired prior to that date were considered eligible for promotion and thus included in the promotional pool. Promotions, Tenure, and Reappointment (PTR) procedures for faculty promotions are explained and included in **ATTACHMENT B** of the *Organizational Analysis* section of the *Plan*.

In addition, applicable sections of the University of Connecticut Professional Employee Association (UCPEA) contract are included to explain the rights that employees have to apply for all positions for which they are qualified and to support the promotional pools used for calculating availability. **ATTACHMENT A**.

### Subsection (c)

In calculating availability the following data elements were considered:

- *The U. S. Department of Education National Center for Educational Statistics (IPEDS), 2013* for Executive/Management, Faculty and several Professional job categories.
- *NCAA Race and Gender Demographics Report* for the Specialist 1A, Specialist 2A, and Specialist 3-4A titles, which encompass coaches and trainers in the Department of Athletics. The University has compiled an Excel spreadsheet to show data corresponding only to sports represented at the University. As agreed to in the prior technical assistance meetings, the “Other Minority” category is included in the “AAIANHNPI Male” or “AAIANHNPI Female” race/gender categories and the data in the “2 or More Races” category, as defined by the Federal Government, is not be included because the State of Connecticut has not yet addressed, or included, this category in its regulations. The Excel spreadsheet and the applicable sections of the actual *NCAA Race and Gender Demographics Report* are contained in **ATTACHMENT C**.

### Subsection (d)

For each occupational category, position classification or job title analyzed, the name of each source consulted and the basis for selection of each source is provided. The sources utilized include:

- Connecticut Department of Labor’s Connecticut Labor Force Data for Affirmative Action, Third Quarter 2015 – **ATTACHMENT B**
- NCAA Race and Gender Demographics Report, 2014-2015 – **ATTACHMENT C**
- The U. S. Department of Education National Center for Educational Statistics (IPEDS), 2013 Tables 314.40, 315.20, 324.30, 324.35, 324.60, 324.70, 323.40 and 323.50 - **ATTACHMENT D**

Additionally, where job titles in the source consulted are not identical to the job titles employed by the agency, the job titles deemed most similar to office, position and position classification within an occupational category or, where appropriate, position classification or job title are documented, and the manner in which the availability base is calculated is substantiated.

**Subsection (e)**

For job titles with twenty-five (25) or more employees in occupational categories where only the entry level positions are filled by hiring and the other job titles in the series are filled by promotion, the availability base is calculated for the entire series and goals are set for the entire series.

**Subsection (f)**

In calculating the availability base the sources used to fill position are determined and assigned weights based on the percentage of positions filled from those sources. The total weight for all sources does not exceed one hundred percent (100%). The percent of each race and sex group from each relevant source is multiplied by the weight given to the corresponding source resulting in a weighted factor. The weighted factors for each race and sex group are added to determine the availability base for each race and sex group in each occupational category, position classification, or job title analyzed.

**Subsection (g)**

The manner in which the availability base is calculated is substantiated in the *Plan*.

*Article 26.*  
**VACANCIES AND JOB POSTING**

**26.1**

All newly created or vacant existing bargaining unit positions shall be posted on the Human Resources web page for two weeks, with an electronic copy to the UCPEA office. This specifically exempts positions that may be created and filled within a single unit. An UCPEA applicant for a bargaining unit position who meets the stated minimum qualifications and identifies him/herself as a member of the unit on his/her vita shall be granted an interview.

**26.2**

An employee, upon request, shall be given the status of her/his application or the reason he/she was rejected for a position.

**26.3**

In no case shall the failure to obtain the position or a disagreement with the reasons for being rejected be grievable or arbitrable under this agreement.

*Article 31.*  
**JOB CLASSIFICATION**

Neither the appeal procedure described below nor the decision to permit UCPEA equal representation on the Job Classification Committee diminish the Board's prerogatives described in Article 3. The agreement regarding Job Classification does not limit the Board's power to determine for the University what jobs are needed, what the content of a job should be, or how a particular job should be structured.

**31.1**

Management and the bargaining unit shall have equal representation on the University's Job Classification Committee. Bargaining unit representatives will be selected by the Union.

**31.2 Reclassification Process**

a. DEFINITION: A job classification analysis may be requested when:

In the opinion of the employee and/or his/her supervisor, job duties have changed to such a degree that the existing classification does not appropriately describe the work that is being done. The change is usually at a higher classification level, but does not eliminate the possibility for lateral changes. The method of classification analysis shall be a job audit performed by specialists in the Department of Human Resources.

b. No job classification request will be considered unless the employee has been consistently performing changed duties for at least two months. An employee may not request an audit of his/her job during his/her probationary year. When an employee

identifies significant changes in his/her job classification, he/she shall meet with his/her supervisor and request that the position be audited. Within four weeks of the initial meeting, the supervisor shall respond by either sending a written request to Human Resources asking that the job change questionnaire be sent to the employee, or notifying the employee that they cannot support reclassifying the position at this time. This does not preclude the initiation of an audit requested by a supervisor or manager without an initial request from an employee, nor does it preclude the removal of duties at any point after a classification specialist or a non-contractual grievance panel determines the changes in duties are at a higher level.

c. Human Resources shall supply the job change questionnaire within one week. The questionnaire will be completed by the employee, reviewed and approved by the supervisory chain, and returned to Human Resources. The employee shall have six weeks to complete his/her part of the questionnaire. The supervisory and managerial review shall be completed within four weeks of receipt from the employee.

d. As soon as practicable following receipt of the job change questionnaire, Human Resources will complete an audit and summarize results in a report. The employee and the manager and/or supervisor will be notified in writing of the audit results. The process within Human Resources shall be completed within 14 weeks.

e. If the audit process reveals that an existing higher-level job classification is appropriate, the first manager outside the bargaining unit shall authorize the change. The effective date of reclassification shall be 60 days prior to the date the job change questionnaire was received in Human Resources. If it is not authorized, the duties identified within the audit report as being at the higher level shall be removed. The employee shall be compensated retroactive 60 days prior to the date the job change questionnaire was received in Human Resources through the date the higher-level duties are removed.

f. If the audit process reveals that the employee's duties are not appropriately classified, and no job description exists, the Department of Human Resources shall prepare a job description to be reviewed and scored by the Job Classification Committee at the next scheduled meeting.

g. If the audit process reveals that the employee is correctly classified, or if the supervisor does not support the employee proceeding with the reclassification process, the employee may appeal under the non-contractual grievance process described in Article 23.3 as amended below.

h. All time limits in 31.2 may be extended by mutual agreement between the UCPEA and the University.

### **31.3 Reclassification Appeals**

- a. Appeals of decisions made under 31.2 shall be processed through the non-contractual grievance process except that the step one response will be considered an audit report prepared by a classification specialist in Human Resources.
- b. Within four weeks of the receipt of the audit results, or the response from the employee's manager not to have the position reclassified at this time, the grievant or the UCPEA may notify the Human Resources designee that she/he wishes to appeal to a non-contractual grievance panel. Two people shall be selected by the process and timelines identified in Article 23.3b.
- c. As part of their investigation, the non-contractual grievance panel selected in accordance with 23.3b shall receive an orientation concerning the University's classification system and shall request that the job be audited by the Department of Human Resources if no audit has previously been conducted. The audit shall take place no later than 21 days after receiving the panel's written request. At their request members of the panel shall be afforded the opportunity to be present during the job audit.

### **31.4**

- d. At step 2 (23.4b) the non-contractual grievance panel shall determine one of the following:
  1. That the employee's duties are properly classified.
  2. That the employee's duties are not properly classified, and a lateral or higher existing job classification is appropriate. In such cases the panel shall specify those duties which justify a lateral or higher classification and recommend that the Provost or appropriate Vice President or their designee carry out one of the following courses of action:
    - a. require Human Resources to place the employee in a lateral or higher existing job classification or
    - b. direct the manager to remove the specific duties which the panel found to be at a lateral or higher level.
  3. That the employee's duties do not appear to fit either his/her current or requested job classification or lateral or higher job classification. In such cases the panel shall specify those duties which do not appear to fit either the current, lateral or higher job classification and shall recommend that the Provost or appropriate Vice President carry out one of the following courses of action:
    - a. require the job classification committee to score the employee's duties or
    - b. direct the manager to remove all specific duties, which the panel found do not appear to fit the current, a lateral or higher job classification.

The Provost or appropriate Vice President or their designee shall decide which of the two courses is appropriate and shall order that it be carried out.

e. This appeal procedure is not available to employees in the following library ranks: University Librarian I, II and III; University Assistant Librarian; University Associate Librarian.

A description of the Job Classification and Equity Analysis Systems shall be available to all employees through the Homer Babbidge and Regional Campus Libraries, as well as on the Human Resources Web Page. All job descriptions will include the total number of points assigned by the Job Classification Committee.

### **31.5 Temporary Positions**

Employees shall not be placed in a position in an acting capacity for more than 18 months unless an active search is in process. The 18 month time limit can be extended by mutual agreement of UCPEA and the University. This time limit does not apply to employees covering for someone on leave of absence, nor does it preclude the negotiation of agreements between the University and UCPEA to address such special issues as departmental reorganizations or training periods, such as may be proposed within the context of career ladders.

### **31.6**

Effective July 1, 2007, if the job classification analysis results in an employee's position being reclassified to a higher level, his/her salary shall be increased to the minimum of the new UCP salary group or by a minimum of \$1,700 for the first UCP salary group change, and \$1,500 for any subsequent UCP salary group change, whichever is greater.

### **31.7 Reclassification & Equity**

Funding shall be available annually to accommodate approved changes in classifications, equity adjustments, and temporary salary increases which result in increased compensation.

\* In 1990, the NCAA began collecting annual demographic data on each member institution utilizing the NCAA Certification of Compliance Form. Each institution was required to return this form to the national office. In 1995, legislation was passed at the NCAA Convention that eliminated this requirement. The Institution Staff Demographic Form was developed to gather this vital information; however, completion of this form was voluntary. Therefore, starting in 1995, only a sample of the population is represented in the Biennial reports. Since the form on which the information is collected changed slightly and there was no longer a census, the Minority Opportunities and Interests Committee (MOIC) decided to use 1995 as baseline data and calculate the aggregate figures every other year to measure broad changes over time. The 1997-98, 1999-00, 2001-02, 2003-04 and the 2005-06 reports were all created from the Institution Staff Demographic Form.

The 2008-09 academic year marked another change in the way the gender, race and ethnicity data were collected. Similar to 1990, race and ethnicity data are required to be reported from the membership on official information forms. Therefore, all member schools are represented in this report and the collection is available annually.

The gender, race and ethnicity for all coaching and administrative positions within the athletics department were reported for each school. Coaching staff includes both full- and part-time positions and volunteers. Individuals with multiple administrative or coaching duties are counted for each position. Therefore, the total percentages reported in the tables reflect the number of positions, not necessarily the total number of individuals.
